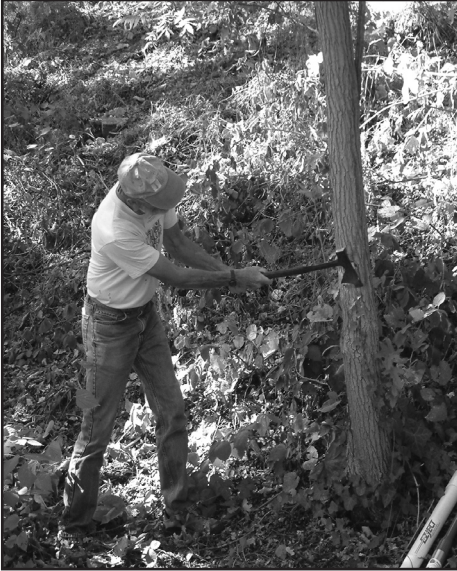


The California Invasive Plant Council presents

Wildland Invasive Weed Field Courses

Control Techniques and Management Series



Course description: Cal-IPC Control Techniques courses provide hands-on, practical demonstrations of weed control methods, taught by invasive weed experts with years of on-the-ground experience. Participants can expect to emerge with an understanding of all major control approaches, including:

- Mechanical controls: power tools, hand tools, and other methods such as solarization, mulching and flaming
- Biological controls
- Chemical control application methods
- Revegetation and desirable plant propagation

Attend a course near you to learn (or review!) the skills needed to develop a comprehensive and integrated land management plan.

Who should attend: These one-day field courses are designed for land managers, restoration practitioners, stewardship volunteers and agency staff – both newcomers and old-timers in the field.
