

Ornamental Plants Invasive in Other Mediterranean Regions

The lists below include plants identified as invasive in one of the Mediterranean-climate regions (Mediterranean basin, western Australia, Cape Region of South Africa, central Chile) that are also sold as ornamental species. These lists are intended as a first step in identifying plants that could become problematic and have no regulatory or other official status. In some cases, plants are classified into multiple families due to discrepancies among references or new classifications. “Naturalized” = listed as naturalized by the Jepson Manual, does not include species that have been present in California since before 1940 without becoming invasive
