



Is it important for Cal-IPC to increase its share of public support? Why?


Generalized public support is important because it ensures adequate:

- Supportive public policy and changes in mainstream practices




Those agencies, especially in urban areas, who have the ability to support progressive environmental education efforts need to do more to educate diverse youth







How does interest/concern for the environment rate those in California?

In a 2003 poll, 52% of those surveyed identified "protecting the environment as important. Twelve other issues ranked higher including the economy, public schools, health care, illegal immigration and family values.

A 2004 poll asked asked respondents to identify the most important environmental issues facing Californians. Here is the ranking:

- 1. Air Pollution (33%)
- 2. General Pollution (8%)
- 3. Water Pollution (7%)
- 4. Water Supply (6%)
- 5. Growth and Over Population (6%)


Ask teachers – when is the best time to instill values around stewardship?? At what age does it become more difficult?


Cal-lpc targets audiences that already value the environment – that already have some basis for understanding the value of protecting bio-diversity.

Cal-IPC allocates a whopping 66% of its total budget on outreach and education.










