# What is backflow prevention?

(also air-gap separation, reduced pressure backflow preventer, or double check valve)

\$600

Any container, other than the original container, that is used to store a pesticide must be identified with this.

# What is

- ◆ the name and address of the person or firm responsible for the container
- ◆ the name of the pesticide
- ◆ the signal word of the pesticide ?

A pesticide application notice must be given to the property operator before a pesticide is applied. Besides the date of application and identity of the pesticide, this shall be included on a pesticide application notice.
