Terms to Help With Identification



Plant Life Cycle

Annual – grows, flowers and dies in one year, typically with simple root system

Perennial – grows more than one year with extensive root system

Deciduous – plant that sheds its leaves seasonally

Growth Form

Erect - upright

Prostrate – growing along ground

Rosette – circular cluster of leaves at ground level, like a dandelion plant

Shrub – woody plant that lives for multiple years

Herb – non-woody, usually annual plant

Spike – in a grass or grass-like plant, a cluster of tightly packed seeds, forming a dense seedhead

Reproduction


Vegetative – asexual reproduction via plant parts other than seeds (rhizomes, stolons, bulbs, etc.)

Rhizome – horizontal stem growing underground

Stolon – horizontal stem growing aboveground
