(Arundo donax)

Mature Size Shoulder

Description

- Large, clump-forming perennial grass 9-30 ft. tall
- Hollow stems divided by partitions like bamboo
- Plume-shaped creamy brown seedheads are 1-2 ft. long and lean to one side
- Pale green to blue-green leaves that "clasp" stem
- Leaves 1-2 in. wide and 1 ft. long; look like corn leaves from a distance
- Reproduces vegetatively from rhizomes and plant fragments
- Spread by water, horticulture
- Native to Europe
