Annual false-brome

(*Brachypodium distachyon*)

Mature Size Ankle



Description

- ½-1½ ft. loosely tufted annual grass with short leaves
- Seedheads 1/3-3 in. long, flattened side to side, ending in a sharp point
- Seeds have short bristles ¼-½ in. long
- Bright green or greenish-blue leaves are flat, sparsely hairy to hairless with smooth edges, usually less than 3 in., very thin, lance-shaped, and rather stiff
- Reproduces by seed
- Spread by waterways and animals
- Native to southern Europe, northern Africa, southwestern Asia, and India

Habitat Grassland, woodland, disturbed sites

Can be Confused with ...
Soft brome

(*Bromus hordeaceus*) an annual grass which is hairy all over, and has rounder, hairier, softer seedheads
