(Cotoneaster franchetii)

Mature Size Shoulder

Description

- Evergreen shrub up to 9 ft. tall
- Fountain-shaped growth form with zigzag branches
- Leaves ¾-1 in. long, dull greygreen above, covered with felty hair below
- Leaves appear silver or white from a distance
- Pink-tinged rose-like clusters of 5-11 flowers
- Orange-red fruits with 3 stones
- Reproduces by seed but resprouts when damaged by grazing, cutting, or fire
- Spread by birds, small mammals, water, human activities
- Native to China

Bloom Period May - Jul

Habitat Agricultural areas, grasslands, roadsides, disturbed sites, coastal scrub, forest
