Canary Island hypericum

(Hypericum canariense)

Mature Size Shoulder

Description

- Upright evergreen shrub up to 15 ft. tall
- Flowers are ½ in. wide with 5 yellow-orange petals, growing in large clusters at ends of branches
- Waxy, opposite leaves are 1-3 in. long, have a



prominent midvein, and appear to have small 'windows' when held up to the light

- Narrow stems with light colored bark
- Reproduces by seed or resprouts from root crown when damaged
- Spread by roads and horticulture
- Native to Canary Islands

Bloom Period May - Jun
