# Japanese honeysuckle

(Lonicera japonica)

#### Mature Size Vine



- Climbing vine up to 30 ft. with oval leaves and small white to yellow flowers
- Tube-like fragrant flowers have 3-lobed upper petals and one-lobed lower petal, are less than ½ in. long, arranged in pairs
- Egg-shaped fruits are small (¼ in.), shiny black berries
- Leaves opposite, 3 in. long by 2 in. wide
- Young leaves covered in short, dense hairs
- Mature leaves hairless on upper surface
- Reproduces by seed and vegetatively by spreading stems
- Spread by horticulture, water, wildlife, waterfowl, livestock
- Native to eastern Asia

### Bloom Period May - Jun

**Habitat** Forest, riparian, disturbed sites
