Cotton fireweed

(Senecio quadritentatus)

Mature Size Knee

Description



- Up to 3.5 ft. perennial forb with silvery white foliage and yellow flowers
- Cylindrical flower heads are yellow-green on the outside with a yellow center, and mature into cottony tufts like dandelions when mature



- Slender linear leaves are 3-9 in. long, alternate, pale green with pointed tips
- Stems and leaves covered in white woolly or cobwebby hairs
- Reproduces by seed
- Spread by wind
- Native to Australia
