

Slender False Brome

Brachypodium sylvaticum

- Loves shade or sun
- Spreads easily
- Large, monoculture stands
- Excludes native plants
- Noxious to grazing animals
- CDFA Class A noxious Weed

Hairs on edge of leaf and stem



Seed heads come directly off main stem






Bright green and glossy leaves


























Hanging sedge Carex pendula

'W' shaped leaves













































About Slender False Brome

A threat to our most precious resource.

Fast growing and extremely aggressive, slender false brome (Brachypodium sylvaticum) inhibits growth of tree seedlings and replaces surrounding

It can cover up to 90% of the ground if not managed — outcompeting pollinator-friendly plants and preventing water from penetrating the roots of larger tree species

The consequences of allowing this noxious weed to settle in our area could be catastrophic.

Slender false brome is currently in the Woodside and La Honda area, the only known location in California. Please join your neighbors and the San Mateo Resource Conservation District in the effort to contain slender false brome!

Protect Our Forests

Slender false brome endangers our local forest ecosystems. The San Mateo Resource Conservation District and the Midpeninsula Regional Open Space District have partnered to protect and preserve the biodiversity of our redwood forests from slender false brome, but we can't do it without you!

1. Schedule a survey for your home. 2. Remove mud & dirt that may

contain seeds from clothing, shoes and equipment after visiting affected areas.

3. Report suspected Slender false brome sightings.


