Workshop: How to Set Up an Early Detection/Rapid Response (EDRR) Program ② 12:30 PM - 2:30 PM, Nov 1

Instructor: Rachel Kesel, One Tam [2.0 "Other" DPR CE credits - take quiz after session]

This training will outline the four cornerstones of an Early Detection, Rapid Response program. First, we'll consider your survey geography with an emphasis on vector pathways for invasive plants. We'll review tools and considerations for selecting target species. Data collection requirements, pitfalls, and opportunities will be discussed at a high level. Because rapid response is the goal of early detection surveys, we'll look at strategies for ensuring treatments are built into your pilot program.
