



Who Was involved?


- Job training center for young adults (18-26) that helps them
 - earn a high school diploma
 - gain job skills
 - pursue college
 - have family-sustaining careers
- Do a lot of environmental enhancement and mitigation projects across the Bay Area – trail construction and maintenance, woodland fire mitigation, habitat restoration and shoreline resiliency, and waterway improvement.



Who Was involved?



- Nonprofit in Oakland, CA
- Uses Hip Hop music & culture as a vehicle for education, empowerment, and employment
- Focuses on promoting positive hip hop culture and skill building for youth







Plants can be...

Invasive

- Quickly reproduce and spread
- Change habitats
- Reduce biodiversity
- Cause extinctions
- Increase fire hazards
- Often introduced

Introduced

- “Non-native”, the opposite of a native plant
- Not native to the place it's been brought into

Native

- A plant that has evolved in an area for thousands of years
- In California, “native” often means plants and animals that were here before European arrival

Weeds

- A plant out of place



P.S. No one calls them STDs!!! They're technically called "soil BORNE diseases"



PHYTOPHTHORA!!!!

- Human activity is the main way it’s spread into wildlands, including restoration work!





How are weeds and soil-borne diseases introduced?



Humans are a major way weeds and soil diseases spread, but that also means we can prevent it!



Make site hygiene part of your routine. Prevention is key!








Afterwards...
