




- 2014 Bernardo Fire





ADAPT & OVERCOME - A FEW CHALLENGES

- Funding
- Capacity
- Community Opposition (Rancho Santa Fe ❤️ Eucalyptus)
- Herbicide 'Limitations'
- LSAA Restrictions on Heavy Equipment, Nesting Season, etc.
- Land Ownership & ROE Permitting
- Covid-19
- Lake Hodges Seismic Issues
- Biomass Management



METHODS: TRIED & TRUE

- Eucalyptus / Acacia / Tamarisk – Cut stump / drill & kill
- Date Palm – drill & kill
- Arundo – cut and spray resprouts
- Biomass – chipping, brush pile ‘habitat structures’, etc.



HOW ARE WE DOING? MONITORING & MORE

- Multispectral Imaging
- “Stacked Cube” – LBV Habitat Structure
- CRAM
- Ongoing Wildlife Surveys
 - E-Bird Transects
 - Herp Surveys
 - Wildlife Cameras
